sexual assault bulletin

On July 6th, UC San Diego Police

Department distributed a bulletin confirming the arrest and subsequent death of the suspect who sexually assaulted a Mesa resident in November 2008. The suspect was arrested on July 1, 2009, around 1:30pm in Mission Valley, after he attacked a woman in her garage. He was linked through DNA testing to 5 other home invasion robberies and sexual assaults throughout the City of San Diego. On the morning of July 3, 2009 the offender was found deceased in the jail cell where he was being held on \$5 million bail.



change of address

When you move from one place to another, unfortunately you must go through the process of notifying everyone you know, including financial institutions, magazines, and any other organizations that send you mail through the United States Postal Service. Please remember that when you move out of Mesa, you need to complete a change of address with the USPS in order to have all of your mail forwarded to your new residence. The process is simple and can be done on-line for \$1. Go to <https://moversguide.usps.com/?referral=USPS> and follow the steps to have all of your mail rerouted from Mesa to wherever you are moving to. It would be very unfortunate to miss bills or important mail because you are no longer living here. Take a moment from moving your personal possessions to make sure your mail moves with you.
